Purpose

Tribal Transportation Planning Organization (TTPO) was established to support the development of tribal transportation planning and capacity building for all Washington State Tribes. This will be accomplished by promoting education of tribal planners and technical staff in the implementation and compliance of current guidelines, policies, regulations and programs relative to transportation and associated fields. TTPO will bring together Washington State tribes and tribal transportation affiliates as a consortium to foster intergovernmental cooperation, communication and coordination, as well as, a forum for the advancement of tribal transportation professionals, and transportation agencies serving the best interest of tribes at the tribal, local, regional, state, and federal levels.

This forum of TTPO transportation partners for tribes in Washington State includes transportation organizations and agencies to coordinate transportation planning issues and to help advocate direct access to national, state and regional funds for tribes. The includes all Washington State tribes, Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT), Federal Highway Administration(FHWA), Tribal Technical Assistance Program (TTAP), Small Urban, Rural and Tribal Center on Mobility (SURTCOM) Eastern Washington University (EWU), Federal Transit Administration (FTA), Washington Traffic Safety Commission (WTSC), Regional Transportation Planning Organizations (RTPOs), Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs), Emergency Federal Relief for Federally Owned Roads (ERFO), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and all other organizations serving for the protection of tribal rights and preservation of tribal cultural.

Guiding Principles and Objectives of the Work Plan

Ensure Education of Transportation Planners and Technical Staff on Transportation Policy and Technical Issues so Recommendations can be made to Decision Makers or Tribes, Local, State and Federal Agencies as Needed

- 1. Coordinate and collaborate with EWU, TTAP, Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) and other training organizations to organize and provide training that meet the needs of tribal transportation programs.
- 2. Provide training, workshops and best practices about tribal planning to include, partnering with stakeholders, tribal fee and trust lands, non-tribal lands, rights-of-way, cultural resources, natural resources, tribal fuel tax initiatives, economic development, climate change, tourism, tribal workforce, local state and federal government programs, and funding sources.
- 3. Provide for round-table discussions to identify best practices and common mistakes made on various types of projects related to transportation and infrastructure.

Improve Accuracy of Data and Asset Management for Tribal Transportation System, Infrastructure, Facilities & Equipment on Tribal Lands

- 4. Continue with TTPO Transit Committee and coordinate Tribal Transit facilities with FTA, WSDOT, and other service providers and funding sources, to include new start-ups, shutdowns, expanding services, technical documentations and polices, etc.
- 5. Coordinate, share information, and identify best practices of tribal transportation programs about transportation infrastructure, transit facilities and equipment resources.
- 6. Coordinate with BIA to provide updates and training on Road Inventory Field Data System (RIFDS) and National Tribal Transportation Facility Inventory (NTTFI).

Encourage Tribal Participation and Coordination with Tribal Transportation Planning Partners in Developing Tribal Transportation Policies and Programs, such as through the Reauthorization of Federal, State and Regional Legislation by Offering Technical Advice, Recommendations, and/or Options to the various Agencies' Decision Makers and their Established Subcommittees or Working Groups

- 7. Enhance inter-tribal communications through sharing of resources, information, methods, processes and best practices to improve tribal transportation programs.
- 8. Seek the participation of other agencies and organizations advocating for tribal transportation to increase awareness and opportunities for tribes, such as, TTPCC, ITA, NCAI, ATNI, CTAA, IACC, etc., to include Metropolitan and Regional Transportation Planning Organizations (M/RTPOs).

Encourage Tribal Participation to seek Federal, State and Regional Transportation Funding

- 9. Provide notifications of funding opportunities (NOFO) from state and federal transportation and planning agencies.
- 10. Identify best practices to improve tribal involvement in regional funding and increase participation in respective RTPOs/MPOs.

Improve Tribal Traffic Safety & Data Analysis on Tribal Lands to Achieve Target Zero

- 11. Continue with WTSC's Tribal Traffic Safety Advisory Board (TTSAB) as TTPO Tribal Traffic Safety Committee to support and improve safety on reservations, tribally owned lands, historically significant lands, and associated access routes.
- 12. Help Tribe's create, update and implement their Tribal Safety Plans to reduce fatal and disabling collisions by using the 4E's as identified by FHWA and the Washington Traffic Safety Commission (WTSC) Target Zero Plan.
- 13. Identify and share procedures, programs, data sources for data banks, crash data analysis, and best practices for tribal transportation programs.
- 14. Help identify options for research and data collection for Tribal Transportation facilities, to include streamlining/consolidating crash data and traffic modeling as related to land use, employment, population, etc.
- 15. Support tribal emergency management for major disasters on tribal lands affecting NTTFI facilities, by assisting with developing emergency management plans and coordination with ERFO, WA State Emergency Management Division and/or FEMA for recovery services and funding.

TTPO Organization

- 16. Coordinate and participate in Tribal-State Transportation Conference to include educational outreach and fundraising opportunity for the TTPO.
- 17. Enhance the organizational effectiveness of the TTPO including but not limited to, establishing self-sufficiency through marketing, fund raising, investments, and outreach to fund support staff for TTPO administration, seek training opportunities, organize quarterly meetings, and if necessary, carrying on with the Annual Tribal Transportation Symposium.
- 18. Conduct quarterly meetings and encourage participation of all Washington State tribes and stakeholders.
- 19. Conduct annual assessments of TTPO activities and seek input for future endeavors.

2022 Work Plan Tasks and Deliverables

1. Ensure tribal staff are educated on transportation policy and technical issues, so recommendations can be made to decision makers for Tribes, local, state and federal agencies as needed and/or requested.
